

Acer-MAPLE

A. ginnala "Flame"

FLAME AMUR MAPLE

A very hardy and tough small growing tree with dense foliage. The seed turns bright red in summer while the leaves are still green. The scarlet leaves in autumn are as brilliant as any of the Maples. A good plant for specimen or screening

15-20' Zone 3 Blooms- April Full Sun / Partial Shade

AESCULUS

Aesculus x carnea "Fort McNair"

PINK FLOWERING HORSECHESTNUT

Large panicles of pink flowers with yellow throats. Large dark green compound foliage is disease resistant

25-30" Zone4-7 Blooms-late spring Full Sun

Aesculus parviflora

BOTTLEBRUSH BUCKEYE

White blooms on 8-12" panicles. Excellent plant for massing under shade trees or in shady areas. White spreading form and stratified branching. Plant in moist, well-drained soil.

8-12' Zone 5-8 Blooms-June-July Full Sun/Partial Shade/Shade

Amelanchier-SERVICEBERRY

A. x grandiflora "Autumn Brilliance"

AUTUMN BRILLIANCE SERVICEBERRY

Showy white flowers in early spring are slightly fragrant. Berries start green and turn to a dark purple in early summer. The edible fruit attracts birds. Brilliant orange-red fall color. Easily grown in range of soils

15-25' Zone 4-8 Full Sun/Partial Shade

AZALEA

Azalea exbury "Gibralter"

GIBRALTAR DECIDUOUS AZALEA (EXBURY HYBRID)

Flame-orange, ruffled flowers in spring

4-7' Zone 5-7 Blooms-Spring Shade

Azalea exbury "Lemon Lights"

LEMON LIGHTS DECIDUOUS AZALEA (EXBURY HYBRID)

Bright, lemon yellow flowers in spring

4-7' Zone 5-7 Blooms-Spring Shade

Azalea exbury "Northern Hi-Lights"

NORTHERN HI-LIGHTS DECIDUOUS AZALEA (EXBURY HYBRID)

White flowers with a yellow blotch appear in late-midseason. Plants are very vigorous and resistant to powdery mildew. Foliage turns red in late summer

4-7' Zone 5-7 Blooms-Late mid-season Shade

Azalea exbury "Orchid Lights"

ORCHID LIGHTS DECIDUOUS AZALEA (EXBURY HYBRID)

Lilac-pink blooms on a semi-dwarf plant

4-7' Zone 5-7 Blooms late mid-season Shade

Azalea exbury "White Lights"

WHITE LIGHTS DECIDUOUS AZALEA (EXBURY HYBRID)

Pale pink buds open to large, white, fragrant flowers, with a yellow blotch. Exceptionally hardy and consistently heavy flowering

4-7' Zone 4-5 Shade

Azalea x "Herbert"

HERBERT AZALEA (GABLE HYBRID)

Vivid purple flowers in early May. Excellent hardiness

4-7' Zone 5-7 Blooms-May Shade

Azalea x "Karen"

KAREN AZALEA (GABLE HYBRID)

Purple blooms. Excellent hardiness

4-7' Zone 5-7 Shade

Amelanchier-SERVICEBERRY

A. alnifolia

SASKATOON SERVICEBERRY

Small-medium shrub of broad character. Delicate white flower in late spring. Fruit is similar to blueberries. It's attractive and edible. Excellent red-orange fall color. Tolerates heavier soils

6-8' Zone 2 Blooms- May Full Sun/ Partial Shade

A. alnifolia "Regent"

REGENT SERVICEBERRY

High quality extra sweet red to black fruit clusters in June. The fruit is similar to a blueberry. The shrub is a spreading, open somewhat vase-shaped shrub that suckers nicely. Very adaptable to dry or wet soils, and tolerates heavy clay in full sun or part shade. The foliage is oval and turns from yellow to red in fall.

4' X 3' Zone 4 Blooms- May Full Sun/Partial Shade

SHADBLOW SERVICEBERRY JUNE BERRY

A large multiple stem shrub with attractive white flowers in early spring followed by dark red fruit birds love. Handsome fall foliage, yellow to red. Excellent native shrub. Grows slowly. Does best in moist, well drained acidic soil. Nice upright form

20' Zone 4 Blooms-April Full Sun/ Partial Shade

Aronia-CHOKEBERRY

A. melanocarpa

BLACK CHOKEBERRY

Small shrub with white clusters of flowers in spring, followed by lustrous black fruits which persist into winter. Red-orange fall color

5-7' Zone 3 Blooms-May Full Sun/Partial Shade/Full Shade

A. melanocarpa "Autumn Magic"

AUTUMN MAGIC

Selection of melanocarpa with larger edible black-purple berries which persist into winter. Dark glossy green foliage, brilliant red-purple in fall. Somewhat slower growing than the species

3-5' Zone 3 Blooms- May Full Sun/Partial Shade

Fargesia-BAMBOO

Fargesia rufa

CLUMPING BAMBOO

Non invasive bamboo. In groups creates an excellent hedge. Orange-red cane sheaths. Vigorous and cold hardy

8-1' Zone 4-7 Full Sun/Partial Shade

Fargesia scabrida

SACABRIDA BAMBOO

Young culms have dark orange sheaths, opening gradually to reveal steel-blue and lavender canes, aging to an olive green.

12-14' Zone 6-9 Full Sun/Partial Shade

Berberis- BARBERRY

B. thunbergii "Admiration"

ADMIRATION BARBERRY

Dwarf red barberry with bright orange-red foliage with contrasting yellow margins. Leaf color continues throughout the summer, turning brilliant red in fall. Broad, upright growth

12-18" Zone 4-8 Full Sun

B. thunbergii "Concorde"

CONCORDE BARBERRY

Intense, deep, dark purple, rounded leaves that have an incredibly velvety look. New growth is red and show up nicely against the deep dark purple older leaves. Plant form is a small globe when mature. Few red fruits follow the inconspicuous blooms. Tolerates dry soils

2' X 3' Zone 4 Blooms-May Full Sun

B. thunbergii "Crimson Pygmy"

CRIMSON PYGMY BARBERRY

A slow growing, compact form of red leaved Barberry. An excellent choice for a sunny foundation planting or great as a low hedge. Deep, dark red leaves turn orange-red in fall.

2' x 2-3' Zone 4 Blooms-May Full Sun

B. thunbergii

JAPANESE BARBERRY

Attractive small green leaves and twiggy branches are covered with brilliant scarlet berries. The foliage takes on a splendid autumn coloring of gold and scarlet. Very good for low hedges.

4-5' Zone 4 Blooms-May Full Sun

B. thunbergii "Rose Glow"

ROSE GLOW BARBERRY

A very striking small colorful shrub. The leaves of the young shoots are mottled silver-pink, bright rose later becoming purple. Dense compact plant. Needs full sun for best leaf color

3' Zone 4 Blooms-May Full Sun

B. thunbergii "Maria"

SUNJOY GOLD PILLAR BARBERRY

Bright golden foliage and red new growth. Bright orange-red fall foliage.

4' Zone 4-8 Full Sun

B. thunbergii "Orange Rocket"

ORANGE ROCKET BARBERRY

Upright growth with foliage colors in vivid shades of red and orange. New growth emerges with orange-red tones deepening to dark red. Light yellow flowers in the spring are followed by small crimson fruit. Foliage hues intensify in fall.

4' Zone 4-8' Full Sun

Buddleia-BUTTERFLY BUSH

B. davidii "Royal Red"

ROYAL RED BUTTERFLY BUSH

Blooms on new wood and should be cut to 8-10' above the ground each spring. Deep, dark, reddish-purple flowers are borne July through September. Full Sun. Upright spreading shrub to about 4'. Attracts butterflies

3-4' Zone 5 Blooms-July-Sept Full Sun

Cornus-DOGWOOD

C. alba "Argenteo-marginata"

EUROPEN VARIEGATED DOGWOOD

Variegated cream and green foliage. Deep red branches in winter. Tolerates heavy soils

6-8' Zone 3 Blooms-May Full Sun/Partial Shade

C. alba "Bailhalo"

IVORY HALO DOGWOOD

Variegated green and white foliage, compact grower. Selected for a better shape and foliage retention through the summer. Red twigs in winter.

6' Zone 3 Blooms-June Full Sun/Partial Shade

C. alternifolia

PAGODA DOGWOOD

Native large shrub or small tree with horizontally spreading branches in irregular tiers. Flowers are white to pale yellow in late spring, followed by bluish fruits in late summer. Good re-purple fall color. A distinctive specimen or accident plant. Prefers a sheltered location with cooler, moist soil.

15-20' Zone 4 Blooms-June Full Sun/Partial Shade

C. baileyi

BAILEY RED-TWIGGED DOGWOOD

Very attractive red stems in winter. Flat clusters of white flowers followed by blue fruits. Tolerates shade and moisture. The reddest stemmed variety. Remove oldest stems to the ground for best stem color each spring.

8-10' Zone 3 Blooms-May-June Full Sun/Partial Shade

C. sericea "Cardinal"

CARDINAL REDOSIER DOGWOOD

Bright cardinal-red winter twig color. Summer twig color is a yellowish green. Remove oldest stems to the ground for best stem color each spring

8-10' Zone 3 Blooms-May-June Full Sun/Partial Shade

C. sericea "Flaviramea"

YELLOW TWIG DOGWOOD

Young shoots bright yellow in winter. Particularly effective when planted with the red-stemmed dogwoods. Ideal for moist or wet locations. White blossom, white fruit. Remove oldest stems to the ground each spring for best color

6-8' Zone 3 Blooms-May-June Full Sun/Partial Shade

C. sericea "Isanti"

ISANTI DOGWOOD

Slow, compact, dense growing, mounding plant. Fine twigs with red color in winter. White flowers in spring are followed by abundant white fruit in summer. Remove oldest stems to the ground each spring for best stem color

5-6' Zone 3 Blooms- May-June Full Sun/Partial Shade

Cotinus-SMOKEBUSH

C. coggygia "Royal Purple Smokebush"

ROYAL PURPLE SMOKEBUSH

Leaves emerge maroon-red and darken to purple-black throughout summer. Smoky plumes appear in July

10-15' Zone 5-8 Sun

Cotoneaster-COTONEASTER

C. apiculatus

CRANBERRY COTONEASTER

Low, dense mounded shrub with pink flowers and arching branches bearing abundant bright red berries which persist into the winter. Small, rounded, shiny dark green leaves turn reddish in fall. A nice ground cover. Prefers well-drained soil

2-3' x 3-5' Zone 5 Blooms-May Full Sun/Partial Shade

C. horizontalis "Perpusilla"

GROUND COTONEASTER

Small, dark green, shiny leaves cover the extremely low spreading branches. Dark pink blooms line the graceful branches in the spring. Bright red berries in the fall

2' Zone 5 Sun

C. lucidus (*acutifolius*)

PEKING OR HEDGE COTONEASTER

Strong, upright shrub with pink flowers. Dark green, glossy foliage turning red in fall. Fruits are reddish at first, then black. Excellent hedge at almost any height up to 10'

8-10' Zone 2 Blooms-May Full Sun/Partial Shade

C. divaricatus

SPREADING COTONEASTER

Small to medium sized shrub of erect habit. Wide spreading branches with small green glossy foliage. Fruits deep red persisting to October. Small, shiny, dark green leaves turn red in fall

6' Zone 5 Blooms-May Full Shade/Partial Shade

C. adpressus "Tom Thumb"

TOM THUMB CREEPING COTONEASTER

Tiny, glossy, dark green leaves turn an excellent red in fall. Where the branches spread, they do root when they touch the ground. Little or no fruit is produced. Full sun and drier soils are best.

1' x 4' Zone 4 Blooms-May Full Sun

Lagerstroemia-CRAMEMYRTLE

L. indica x fauriei "Victor"

VICTOR CRAPEMYRTLE

A dwarf, compact form. Dark red blooms in July and August and reddish-yellow fall color. Good mildew resistance

3-5' Zone 5-8 Full Sun

L. x. indica "Red Fills"

RED FILLI DWARF CRAPEMYRTLE

Hardy with outstanding red blooms on new wood. Perfect for borders or masses. Compact. Nice red-orange fall color

1-2' Zone 5-8 Full Sun

L. x indica "Violet Filli"

VIOLET FILLI DWARF CRAPEMYRTLE

Hardy with outstanding violet blooms on new wood. Perfect for borders or masses. Compact. Nice red-orange fall color

1-2' Zone 5-8 Full Sun

Daphne-DAPHNE

D. x burkwoodii "Carol Mackie"

CAROL MACKIE DAPHNE

Medium green foliage with delicate cream margins. Clusters of sweetly fragrant, light pink blossoms in May

3-4' Zone 4-6 Blooms-May Full Sun

Diervilla-HONEYSUCKLE

D. sessilifolia "Cool Splash"

COOL SPLASH BUSH HONEYSUCKLE

Clusters of yellow trumpets top variegated foliage, that holds even in the shade. Densely branched, deciduous shrub. Tolerant of inhospitable soil types

3-4' Zone 4-7 Full Sun/Partial Shade

Deutzia-DEUTZIA

Deutzia "Kolmaspri"

SPRING SENSATION DEUTZIA

Garlands of white blooms from the ground to the very tips of each gracefully, arching stem. Carefree. Good for mixed border or cascading over a wall

3-4" Zone 5-9

Euonymus-EUONYMUS

E. alatus

WINGED EUONYMUS, BURNISH BUS

A slow growing, heavily branched shrub distinguished by the broad corky wings on the branchlets. In sun, this plant turns an excellent rose-red fall color that lasts a long time. Great accent or hedge plant

8-10' Zone 3 Full Sun/Partial Shade/Full Shade

E. fortunei "Canadale Gold"

CANADALE GOLD EUONYMUS

Large, green leaves with deep golden yellow margin. Strong branches form a sturdy compact plant

3' Zone 5 Partial Sun

E. alatus "Compactus"

DWARF BURNING BUSH

A dwarf version of the burning bush and more compact. Red fall color is best in full sun. Excellent as a hedge as it only needs to be pruned once a year.

5-6' Zone 4 Full Sun/Partial Shade/Full Shade

E. fortunei "Emerald Gaiety"

EMERALD GAIETY EUONYMUS

Foliage is deep green with an irregular white margin which can take on a pink tinge for the winter. Low growing. Can climb is planted next to a structure.

4-5' Zone 5-9

E. fortunei "Emerald 'n Gold"

EMERALD 'N GOLD EUONYMUS

Good groundcover with a broad upright spreading habit. Foliage is dark glossy green with distinctive yellow margies

1 1/2- 2' Zone 5-8 Full Sun/Partial Shade

E. fortunei "Green Lane"

GREEN LANE EUONYMUS

Lustrous, leathery green oval leaves on erect, spreading branches

3-4' Zone 5-7 Full Sun

E. fortunei "Moonshadow"

MOONSHADOW EUONYMUS

Deep green wavy leaves with bright yellow centers.

1-2' Zone 5-7 Full Sun

Forsythia-FORSYTHIA

F. x "Meadowlark"

MEADOWLARK FORSYTHIA

Strong vigorous hybrid forsythia developed for flower bud hardiness to -35 F. Easy to grow. Tolerates a wide range of soil conditions. Spectacular spring show. Golden blooms last a very long time. Trim and thin branches after bloom

8' Zone 3 Blooms- April Full Sun/Partial Shade

F. x "New Hampshire Gold"

NEW HAMPSHIRE GOLD FORSYTHIA

Smaller, more compact 5-6 foot Forsythia. Flower bud hardiness to -35 F. Lemony yellow flowers. Attractive, finely branched plant. Green summer foliage that turns red-purple in fall. Grown best in full sun, but takes light shad. Very easy to grow in almost any soil.

5-6' Zone 3 Blooms-April Full Sun/Parial Shad

F. x "Northern Gold"

NORTHERN GOLD FORSYTHIA

Large lemon yellow flowers in great numbers making an impressive spring show. Easy to grow. Prune heavily after bloom.

8' Zone 4 Blooms-April Full Sun/Partial Shade

F. x "Sunrise"

SUNRISE FORSYTHIA

A semi-spreading compact habit, combined with numerous branches. Abundant bright yellow branches are produced on short lateral branches. Can be planted as a specimen or in mass. Deep green, glossy foliage all season.

5' Zone 4 Blooms-April Full Sun/Partial Shade

Fothergilla-FOTHERGILLA

F. major "Mount Airy"

MOUNT AIRY FOTHERGILLA

Incredible white fragrant flowers resembling a bottlebrush in April into May. Blue green leaves with whitish undersides appear after flowering. Fall color is a myriad of yellow, orange and red. Requires an acidic, well-drained soil that has some protection from afternoon heat and adequate moisture during drought conditions. Can get up to 4' in ideal conditions.

3-4' Zone 5 Blooms-April-May Full Sun/Partial Shade

Hamamelis-WITCHHAZEL

H. virginiana

COMMON WITCHHAZEL

A large shrub with small bright yellow, sweetly fragrant, starburst-shaped flowers. Blooms appear in early October after the beautiful golden-yellow fall foliage has dropped. Prefers moist, well drained soil. Slow grower.

15' Zone 5 Blooms-Oct Full Shade/Partial Shade/Full Shade

Hibiscus-ROSE OF SHARON

H. syriacus "Diana"

DIANA ROSE OF SHARON

Waxy dark green foliage. Huge single white blooms up to 4" diameter. Flowers stay open at night!

6-8' Zone 5 Blooms-July-Frost Full Sun

H. syriacus "Minerva"

MINERVA ROSE OF SHARON

Lavender blooms with hints of pink and a red eye.

6-8' Zone 5 Blooms-July-Frost Full Sun

H. syriacus "Minifren"

FIRST EDITION BALI HIBISCUS

Bird

5-8' Zone 5-8 Blooms-July-Sept. Full Sun

H. syriacus "Mineru"

FIRST EDITION TAHITI HIBISCUS

Semi double blooms. Deep pink-purple flowers accentuated with a deep red center. Cross between Lavender Chiffon

5-8' Zone 5-8 Blooms-July-October Full Sun

Hydrangea-HYDRANGEA

H. arborescens "Annabelle"

ANNABELLE HYDRANGEA

Large 10-12' snow-white globe shaped flowers. Low erect shrub. Rich green foliage. Sturdy stems support flowers and blooms dependably. Japanese beetles don't like this plant! Prune to a few inches above the ground every spring.

3-4' Zone 3 Blooms-July-Sept. Full Sun/ Partial Shade/Full Shade

H. arborescens "Bella Anna"

BELLA ANNA HYDRANGEA

A color breakthrough. Dark green foliage and rich magenta-pink mophead flowers all summer long

3-4' Zone 3-7 Full Sun/Partial Shade

H. macrophylla "Blushing Bride"

BLUSHING BRIDE HYDRANGEA

Pure white flowers mature to soft pink. Re-blooms on new wood for endless summer color. Grows best in part sun

3-6' Zone 4-9 Full Sun/Partial Shade

H. arborescens "Bounty"

BOUNTY SMOOTH HYDRANGEA

White flowers that are smaller than Annabelle. Strong, sturdy stems make it less likely to flop after rain. Dark green foliage. Reliable bloomer

5' Zone 3-9 Full Sun/Partial Shade

H. macrophylla "Lemon Daddy"

LEMON DADDY HYDRANGEA

Thick, shiny chartreuse leaves and giant, pink mop-head flowers

3-4' Zone 5-9 Full Sun/Partial Shade

H. macrophylla "Mystical Emerald"

MYSTICAL EMERALD HYDRANGEA

Soft pink flowers with a green eye appear in the Spring. As the flowers mature they take on a soft-green color, intensifying to emerald-green in Summer

3-4' Zone 5-9 Full Sun/Partial Shade

H. macrophylla "Mystical Opal"

MYSTICAL OPAL HYDRANGEA

Blooms of ruffled pink florets fade to a soft green, pink and yellow. In fall, the flower heads age to emerald-green with pink petal tips. Grows best in part sun

3-4' Zone 5-9 Full Sun/Partial Shade

H. macrophylla "Mystical Ruby"

MYSTICAL RUBY HYDRANGEA

Ruby-red flower heads. As the flowers mature, they take on a richer red color, each flower with a green eye

3-4' Zone 5-9 Full Sun/Partial Shade

H. paniculata "DVPpinky"

PINKY WINKY HYDRANGEA

Strong upright stems. Dark pink fall bloom coloration and extra large panicles

6-8' Zone 3-8 Full Sun/Partial Shade

H. paniculata "HYPMAD1"

WHITE DIAMONDS HYDRANGEA

White panicles in the summer and fall. Dark green, leathery foliage. Heat and drought tolerant. Smaller stature makes it perfect for tight places

4-5' Zone 3-8 Full Sun/Partial Shade

H. paniculata "Little Lamb"

LITTLE LAMB HYDRANGEA

A small *H. paniculata* with showy white flowers. A hardy, reliable bloomer

4-6' Zone 3-8 Full Sun/Partial Shade

H. quercifolia "Sikes Dwarf"

SIKES DWARF OAK LEAF HYDRANGEA

A compact form with white panicle flowers in summer. Oak-like leaves turn brilliant crimson in fall

3-4' Zone 5-9 Full sun/Partial Shade

H. macrophylla "Bailmer"

ENDLESS SUMMER HYDRANGEA

Beautiful pink (or blue flowers in acidic soils) all summer long. Flowers are produced on both old wood and new wood. Blooms up to 8" across. Overwinter like you would a rose bush. East exposure is best, in a rich, well-drained and cool soil. Water frequently.

2-3' Zone 4 Blooms-June-Frost Full Sun/Partial Shade

H. paniculata "Grandiflora"

PEE GEE HYDRANGEA

One of the showiest or hardy large shrubs. Florets, appearing in summer and fall, are white, fading to pink. Cascading stems. Prefers moist soil.

6-8' Zone 4 Blooms-Aug-Sept. Full Sun/Partial Shade

H. paniculata "Pink Diamond"

PINK DIAMOND HYDRANGEA

A selection of Pee Gee Hydrangea. Flowers open white and age to a rich pink. Huge blooms measure 12". Rarely fed on by Japanese beetles.

6-8' Zone 4 Blooms- July-Aug Full Sun

H. paniculata "Tardiva"

TARDIVA LATE PANICLE HYDRANGEA

A later bloomer. Flowers are 6-8" long and are white and age to light pink. Rarely fed on by Japanese beetles.

6-8' Zone 3 Blooms-Aug-Sep Full Sun/Partial Shade

H. paniculata "Unique"

UNIQUE HYDRANGEA

Hydrangea with 12" long, upright blooms. Blooms begin in mid July and continue into winter. Very showy. Rarely fed on by Japanese beetles.

6-8' Zone 4 Blooms-Aug-Sept Full Sun/Partial Shade

H. arborescens "Abetwo"

INCREDIBALL HYDRANGEA

An improved Annabelle with sturdy stems and stupendously large, creamy white blooms. Prolific flowering

4-5' Zone 4 Partial Sun

H. aborescens "NCHA1"

INVINCIBELLE SPIRIT HYDRANGEA

A beautiful rebloomer with spectacular bright pink bloom heads that appear from early summer to frost. Large, coarse, dark green leaves.

3-5' Zone 3 Sun/Partial Shade

H. macrophylla "PIIHM"

ENDLESS SUMMER TWIST-N-SHOUT BIGLEAF HYDRANGEA

Abundant blooms on both old and new wood all summer. Lacy, deep-pink centers are surrounded by gorgeous blossoms of pink or periwinkle blue, depending on soil type. Sturdy red stems and glossy deep green leaves turn red-burgundy in fall.

3-5' Zone 4-9 Sun/Partial Shade

H. paniculata "Limelight"

LIMELIGHT HYDRANGEA

Bright, lime-green to cream flowers. In fall the blooms display shades of pink, burgundy and green. Excellent vigor and good bloomer. Prefers moist, well-drained soil. Flowers on new wood

6-8' Zone 3-8 Sun/Partial Shade

H. paniculata "Jane"

LITTLE LIME HYDRANGEA

A dwarf form of Limelight Hydrangea. Same flowers but is about a third the size. Soft lime-green flowers mature to pink and burgundy in fall.

3-5' Zone 3-8 Sun/Partial Shade

H. paniculata "Bulk"

QUICK FIRE HYDRANGEA

Quick to bloom, a month earlier than other varieties. Deep pink flowers. Rarely fed on by Japanese beetles

6-8' Zone 4-8 Blooms-May-June Sun/Partial Shade

H. paniculata "Renhy"

FIRST EDITION VANILLA STRAWBERRY HYDRANGEA

Enormous flower panicles are a blend of strawberry and vanilla, upright on red stems. They emerge creamy white in mid summer and change to pink and finally to strawberry red. New blooms give the plant a multicolored effect in late summer. Starts upright and becomes cascading later in the season. Excellent for fresh cut.

6-7' Zone 4-8 Sun/Partial Shade

H. paniculata "HYPAD II"

MINUET WEIGELA

Dwarf with excellent hardiness. Foliage is green with a purplish cast. Great for foundations or small shrub border or in perennial beds. Flower buds are red, which open to a lilac purple and yellow throat. From a distance the blooms take on a pinkish-purple look.

Brilliant purple blooms are profuse in April and May with sporadic blooms throughout the season. Vigorous and disease resistant

Y. filamentosa

ADAM'S NEEDLE YUCCA

Stemless evergreen plant producing dense clumps of erect narrow green leaves. The creamy white bell-shaped flowers on tall spikes in mid summer. Great plant for rock garden or foundation planting. Prefers a dry, sunny location. May not bloom annually when young.
